

Home Grown Success: Bridgette Morrison Tells Her Story

ridgette Morrison graduated from UTech, Ja in November 2015 after completing the Bachelor of Business Administration programme with a major in Accounting and minor in Marketing. Prior to graduating, Bridgette participated in the Co-operative Education (Co-op Ed) programme between January 5 and June 30, 2015. At the end of the Co-op Ed Placement she was offered full-time employment by KPMG, and this commenced in August of the same year. Bridgette's first position with the Company was as an Assistant II; since then she has been promoted twice and now she is currently an Accountant II.

Bridgette recounted that as a fulltime student at the University, while engaged in Co-op Ed, she also had other obligations to fulfill such as, that of dorm Resident Assistant for 42 females (including herself). She also had to oversee over 10 different committees on dorm, was a member of the UTech,

Ja Choir and a member of the Accounting Students Association. With all these responsibilities she had to practice time management. She had to select her classes during the evenings from 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. because she had a regular work schedule of 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. daily. After school she had to do her dorm duties and be on time for meetings when called. It was very challenging for her but equally rewarding because at the end of the day she had not only successfully completed her Co-op Ed experience but also completed her course of study with honors. Bridgette reported that she had to make critical decisions regarding whether or not she wanted to have fun now and to miss out on something that could have been a life changing opportunity for her. She has no regrets because she walked right out of University and walked straight into a job opportunity

that was totally in line with her career goals. Had it not been for the Co-op Ed Programme, Bridgette is not sure if she would have gotten her chance to be at KPMG. It was through the programme she became aware of KPMG. The programme provided her with support and tips on how to present herself while on Co-op Ed.

Bridgette recommends that students who are participating in the Co-op Ed programme need to go with an open mind, be willing to use their initiative and be willing to work hard. She stated "they need to have a new mind set, have a attitude change to say that they have come to get something, this is what they want and they are not leaving without it. Show your supervisor that you are capable, be proactive, ask around if there is any work that needs to be done, be willing to accept challenges and deal with it well". As a means of giving back to the programme, Bridgette suggested that she could be a mentor for students and tell them real life stories about who have succeeded and come out on top.

- * Resume Builder: Co-op Ed is key to building experience as a student. Employers are much more likely to hire someone with Co-op Ed experience rather than someone with a generic resume, lacking experience.
- * Time Management: As a Co-op Ed student, you'll become a master of time management. When you're working in a fast paced professional environment you need to know every minute counts. Time management is vital in every circumstance whether you're attending meetings, finishing tasks on deadlines, making phone calls, etc.
- * Career Foundation: Co-op Ed provides you with the building blocks you need for your future. Many Co-op Ed opportunities help set

Skills employers want in a Co-op Ed student:

- * Adaptability: While you may have an interest in a particular aspect of an industry, a willingness to become familiar with the different parts of an organization is definitely viewed as an asset (and also increases your exposure within the company)
- * **Critical Thinking:** Critical thinking refers to your ability to analyse and evaluate a situation or issue and form a judgment
- * Use your own initiative: be able to take it upon yourself to contribute or positively affect change. Do not wait to receive direction for every task, and be willing to assist others with their work.
- * **Collaboration**: Your ability to communicate and relate well to others is certainly important for collaboration, as is the capacity to work with others toward a common goal.
